
Spondon Community Association has been in existence since 1977. The Village Improvement Committee started in 2001, entering East Midlands in Bloom in 2004, winning that and subsequently in 2006, 2007 and 2009. We have won Britain in Bloom in 2005 and gained a silver award in 2010.

In addition to their chosen 'good cause' Safari Stops are asked to make a donation to the Village Improvement Committee.

In 2015, the Safari attracted almost visitors and raised a total £5200. Of this £1,138.23 was donated to The Village Improvement Committee to support their work in making our village more attractive and maintaining the public places; West Park Meadow Local Nature Reserve, The Sensory Garden and finally Dale Road Park where a Toposcope and audio board provide information about where it is.
